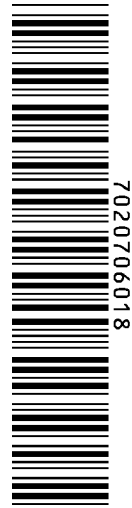

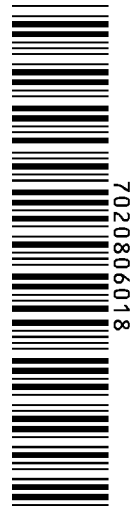

(See **Note** below.) If you claim the N.C. standard deduction, do not complete Part C. Enter the appropriate amount for your filing status from the following chart on Form D-400, Line 11. Otherwise, complete Part C, Itemized Deductions. **Note:** If you are (1) married filing a separate return for North Carolina income tax purposes and your spouse itemizes deductions, or (2) a nonresident alien, or (3) filing a short-year return because of a change in your accounting period, you are not entitled to the standard deduction.
