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Why Do You Need A Power of Attorney

For your protection and the business's protection, if you are not the business owner or corporate officer of the company, you must have a signed Power of Attorney, [Form Gen-58](#), in order to receive decals, information, or conduct business with the Department regarding the account.

- Friends
- Employees of the business

NCDMV/IRP Power Of Attorney

- The account number and account name must be entered on Power of Attorney
- The POA must indicate the person allowed to sign for individual or company
- The POA must be notarized
- The original POA is retained in IRP office
- You must notify IRP office in writing if you wish to cancel POA

Power of Attorney(POA) - GEN 58

Not a Power of Attorney: This form is for the appointment and empowerment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in certain specified matters. It is not to be used for the appointment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters.

Limited Power of Attorney: This form is for the appointment and empowerment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in certain specified matters. It is to be used for the appointment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters.

Durable Power of Attorney: This form is for the appointment and empowerment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters. It is to be used for the appointment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters, including those matters that may arise in the future.

Springing Power of Attorney: This form is for the appointment and empowerment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters. It is to be used for the appointment of an agent to act on behalf of the principal in all matters, including those matters that may arise in the future, but only after a specified event has occurred.
